The Treasurer reported as follows:

Tim Abel presented the Treasurer's report. The Council ended the month of September with an ending balance of \$9,005.15. Total cash receipts of \$9,864.99 and total disbursements of \$5,381.84.

We are estimating about a \$3,000 profit from the golf outing. The Council thanks Luke Filosa, Jeff Lopez, Tim Abel, and Dan Lafayette for all their work with spearheading the outing. Thank you to Jeff Furler for donating the time share to the Ozarks...it went in an auction and raised \$450.

Do we include the profits made from other things that took place during the golf outing and then use this towards the proceeds that go to the church? Guy DiCiaula made a motion to include all profits in our 10% gift to the Parish. Chad Baldwin seconded the motion. The motion was approved by a vote of the members present.

The following committees reported:

Baseball game went well. There will be another opportunity next year for the Council to attend a Cardinals game.

The soccer outing resulted in 5-6 kids showing up. Each kid won their division. The kids advance now to the regional competition...maybe in Ottawa. If kids do well there, they will move onto State.

Church grounds cleanup resulted in 10-11 guys showing up. The group cleaned up corn husks, trimming of some bushes, chopping down of two trees.

Lesson learned from the golf outing...missed a potential sponsor due to the timing of the outing.

The following new business was brought up:

Paul Rayburn addressed the Council on behalf of the Bloomington/Normal Young Catholics which represent young Catholic couples and unmarried Catholics between the ages of 22-35. They started meeting as a group with most parishes represented in town. A cookout in August resulted in 40 people showing up and a Facebook® following has about 75 people. The group is planning an event in October and asking the council for a donation of \$100. The Council will have its name on advertisements for this. Chad Baldwin made a motion to provide \$100 to the Bloomington/Normal Young Catholics. Joe Klingler seconded the motion. The motion was approved by a vote of the members present.

Deacon Pool: Plea for help with RCIA to get more sponsors. Currently have about 8-12 candidates. Attendance requirements involve participation in RCIA classes after the 9:00 Mass, every Sunday morning from 10:15 – 11:15. The first rite is coming up and would like to have candidates and sponsors meet before this. Jeff Furler gave his perspective on RCIA as he has sponsored three candidates.

Lecturer Dan Hunt: Dan Deneen will provide estate planning planned for the October 18 meeting. From this meeting we would have Jason Bramley come to talk more to the council about a few of the items covered by Dan.

Welcome to Chad Baldwin who is transferring from the Normal Council.

The District Deputy reported as follows: On the state web-site there is a list of approved organizations the Council can donate money made from the tootsie roll sales to. Special education organizations and schools would be good organizations to consider, and there are several in the community to consider.
